


Campus Report




Dr. Lee-feng Chien, the first employee at Google Taiwan, gave a speech titled "Extend the Golden Years from 2 to 10".

In Dr. Chien's view, the global economy has been severely hit by the COVID-19 pandemic since the end of 2019. Over the last two years, as difficult as they may seem, Taiwan has seen a relatively stable economic development and even growth thanks to its electronics processing industry and chip manufacturing industry, which have acted as the backbone of the Taiwanese economy and created a "golden 2 years" for Taiwan in this difficult time. How can Taiwan propel the success over the past two years toward the next 10 years as the pandemic eases? Dr. Chien gave a simple answer to this question: Startups! Many Taiwanese industries have been tunnel-visioned about the domestic and Chinese markets. What these industries should do is to expand their businesses to the other side of the Pacific Ocean, showing the world how good our products are and opening up new markets for effective business expansion. Dr. Chien also pointed out the importance of collaboration between the traditional hardware industry and the new software industry for mutual growth rather than separating themselves from each other. Support for digital transformation in industries is also critical for new industries to expand overseas and can thus help Taiwan become the center of East Asia and the hub of software and hardware businesses.

Essay Sharing



Taiwan's semiconductor industry, now the world's largest, became active in the 1980s. At that time, the U.S. electronics industry stopped making entire personal computers in its own country. It proposed and implemented a three-polar structure; the heart of the computer would be built in the West Coast region of the U.S., the devices would be manufactured in Taiwan, and the setup would be done in China. Taiwan proposed the idea of building a science park in Hsinchu, which served as a receptacle for the U.S. proposal. At that time, it was said that the world was in the era of science parks, and Japan also developed the Tsukuba area. However, only a group of national research institutes were built in Tsukuba, and private research institutes moved to other locations within a few years. It was a science park concept without a global strategy. Since the COVID-19 pandemic, it is now being said that this may be a second Cold War, and Japan needs to take a cue from the electronics industry trends in the 1980s and respond to global trends while simultaneously making appropriate judgments of its own. I feel this will make Japanese science stronger.
