The 5th Taiwan Association for Institutional Research Annual Meeting and International Conference 2024 was completed successfully.

The 5th Taiwan Association for Institutional Research Annual Meeting and International Conference (TAIR 2024) was held on Friday, February 23, 2024, at the Bo'ai Campus of National Yang Ming Chiao Tung University. The conference was coorganized by the Taiwan Association for Institutional Research (TAIR), National Yang Ming Chiao Tung University, National Chung Hsing University, Chung Shan Medical University, Minghsin University of Science and Technology, and Hungkuang University. In the opening speech, President Lin Chi-Hung, Chairman of TAIR, emphasized that as institutional research in Taiwan continues to expand, the importance of this field for school governance and development, as well as the need for international connections, should be recognized by all higher education institutions. He also mentioned that institutional research is gradually moving towards internationalization and establishing global networks. The conference attracted approximately 250 participants, including domestic and international institutional research partners, experts, and scholars from various fields.

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The conference focused on "Data Governance" and "International Talent Cultivation." In addition to presentations by two international experts, the conference showcased 74 research papers, comprising 28 oral presentations and 46 poster presentations.
