參訪目的：與英、愛各重要大學相關所系建立交流管道，進行雙邊合作計畫，針對研究人員互訪及數位檔案、文獻資料分享機制，簽署其互惠約定。

先期工作：

- (1) 出發之前，先有三次會議就聯絡分工及各校交談對象及合作議題、具體行程、經費項目等均做資訊簡報與意見交換。
- (2) 所有參訪學者之CV及研究領域均先email給對方，並完成外文學門之簡介小冊(如附件一)及powerpoint(如附件二)，以便雙邊能在最短的時間內做最有效之交談，形成共識。
- (3) 由外文學門準備信函致參訪單位(見附件三)，將訪問目的及行程均明確敲定。

計劃進行（行程表詳見附件四）：

- (1) 六月十七日一團九人出發，搭乘長榮班機赴英，於晚上8:00抵倫敦，由國科會駐英科技組之陳嘉猷副組長陪同，搭乘已預訂的小巴士進城，在Premier Travel Inn, London完成住宿手續，已近半夜。
- (2) 六月十八日上午八時半出發赴Brunel University，九點半與副校長Chris Jenks見面，由於Jenks教授與李有成、何文敬教授是舊識，且與廖炳惠教授有數面之緣，因此第一天上午的拜會活動非常成功，十點半與英文系、藝術學院、政經學院之國際交流中心之院長、系主任位及其他幾位教授見面，先由召集人做powerpoint之簡報，對方表示歡迎，就下列項目作進一步之規劃：a. 研究生及教

授交流互訪；b. 針對特定議題如Diaspora、Postcolonial studies、拉岡與精神分析、早期歐洲文化、各時期之英國文學及藝術，均可進行NSC與AHRC之雙邊合作計劃；c. 數位檔案之分享，尤其Brunel所建立之南亞移民資料；d. 當代中國與台灣電影與文化研究之交流，最後雙邊則決議再進一步談後續之交流計劃，由Jenks教授率團於九月中來台，做詳盡之規劃向NSC與AHRC提出。

六月十八日下午二時立即趕往愛爾蘭都柏林，由於機場之安檢嚴格及隨身行李之限制，頗費一番功夫才完成手續，抵達都柏林住進No. 31的民宿已是晚上九時左右。No.31是建築家精心設計宅屋，空間美學與現代擺設，尤其早餐服務均令人印象深刻，頗有文化空間教養之經驗。

(3) 六月十九日參訪都柏林的三一學院，先由Mr. Joseph O’Gorman簡介校史、帶領校園參觀活動，再由文學院院長Terence Brown 主持會議，該院有三位教授出席，會議於十一點到中午，科技組胡昌智組長亦與會，但Brown教授表示不宜猝然進行博士生來三一學院之交流，除非愛爾蘭人文研究中心願提供一些機制性補助，但在會前雙方並未達共識，此次拜會活動只是彼此了解研究現況。中午，Brown教授安排午餐，雙方進一步懇談。餐後繼續校園參觀活動。

原定十九日下午二時進入NUI (國立愛爾蘭大學Maynooth校區)，但由於交通事故延誤遲到一個半小時，抵達時已四點，但英文系系主任Chris Morash仍很懇切招待，他表示其他同事均有會議無法參加，但他會將訊息帶給大家，在聽完廖召集人之簡報及交流以後，雙方就a. Joyce研究及當代愛爾蘭文學、劇場；b. 寒假或暑期之外文營；c. 研究生或訪問學者來NUI均形成共識，離開之前，Morash教授致贈其著作及一本由該校副校長所著之*People and Place*，回來以後也收到其信表示願再進一步就交流細節做追述。

(4) 六月二十日早上八時出發，走訪都柏林學院(UCD)，與文學院及高等人文研究院之主管、教授：Terence P. Dolan, Mary Clayton, Marc Caball, 等五人見面，主要以外文學門之介紹小冊及廖召集人之簡報為主，雙方立刻決定就：a. 殖民主義之比較研究；b. 愛爾蘭現代文學，乃至當代英國族裔研究；c. 離散研究；d. 圖書檔案文獻之分享；e. 研究生及訪問學者之交流進行後續之連絡，Mark Caball尤其建議與IRCHSS合作。會後由兩位教授Mary Clayton與Terence P. Dolan及一位台灣學者Dr. Hwee-San Tan (陳慧珊，民族音樂學副教授)帶領參觀校園，氣氛融洽，彼此互訪之日期更加確定。回來以後也收到Prof. Mary Clayton來信表示願保持聯繫，進一步交流。當日下午安排文化參訪，並去了James Joyce的城堡。

(5) 六月二十一日一大早七點便趕至機場，飛Bristol，由於行李過重問題，到最後三十分鐘才趕忙上機，相當緊張，而飛機進機場時則更是驚險跳動，令乘客領略了愛爾蘭人的强悍性格。中午前抵達Bristol，卻發現科技組並未代訂旅館，只得臨時加訂，所幸仍有空房，但是兩點即得趕到Bristol University與該校教授見面，不算從容。

二十一日下午二時抵Bristol University，在國際研究會館，與文學院院長、國

際事務副主任、人文研究中心主任及各學門(英文、歷史、哲學、人類學、音樂、漢學)之學者見面、先聽取他們所做的簡介，其次是廖召集人之powerpoint簡介，院長及許多與會學者均在該校提出：人文重點領域(Colonialism；Medieval studies；Performativity；Migration；Digital archive等)看出交集所在，因此很快就外文學門之post-graduate exchange、summer institute，journal project形成共識，四點到五點之下午茶更帶動其合作氣氛。Bristol之台灣學生多達100人，有兩位來擔任我們的嚮導，交流十分歡暢。

(6) 二十二日赴AHRC與幾位計劃負責人Dr. Carl Dolan (project manager), Prof. Evelyn Welch等見面，這次見面胡昌智組長也出席，在雙方之簡報與問答後，由AHRC安排他們的Beyond Text，Strategic Fund，計劃補助情況及其合作案之雙邊審核機制要點報告，彼此進展理解其哲學架構及實際操作層面，大有助益。中午透過午餐，大家又更進一步交談，對NSC所簽署之合約及其內涵有所掌握，Carl Dolan是其主要負責人，其email如下附件（附件五）。

二十二日下午則搭小巴士返回倫敦，行程超過四小時，又住進Premier Travel Inn, London。

(7) 二十三日到二十四日則是倫敦藝文之旅，到處尋覓作家之故居，也赴書店街(Foyles, Blackwell等)，大英博物館、大英圖書館、現代美術館、莎翁劇院參訪。主要由李有成所長帶領，李教授對城市與文藝之掌故相當熟悉，魏念怡小姐因此建議國科會外文學門不妨組團由李教授帶年輕學者來英認識其人文風情。

(8) 二十五日赴University of Essex，與Peter Hulme，Hiroko Tanaka等人見面，雙方就Travel，Colonial encounter，postcolonial studies及diaspora之交流達成多點之共識。

(9) 二十六日赴University of Kent，並參觀Canterbury大教堂。

(10) 二十七日赴Royal Holloway College拜訪，由英文系系主任Robert Hampton協同該系另四名教授接待。下午驅車赴諾丁漢。

(11) 二十八日分別走訪Nottingham Trent University與University of Nottingham兩所大學。

(12) 二十九日赴University of Leeds及King's College參訪。

二〇〇七年六月十八日上午九時三十分，訪問團抵達位於倫敦郊區Uxbridge的布魯納爾大學 (Brunel University)。該校校長Chris Jenks特別在校長室接待訪問團，並晤談了約三十分鐘，然後由該校人文藝術學院院長Steve Dixon帶領至會議室與該校其他教師見面。該校參與座談的教師除Steve Dixon外，尚包括William Watkin, Philip Tew, Tanya Krzywinska等。社會科學學院院長Dany Nobus隨後加入。

Steve Dixon和William Watkin分別介紹該校人文藝術學院和英文系的現況。從Watkin的說明中，可以看出該校英文系有若干強項可以和我國學者合作，包括後殖民文學、愛爾蘭文學、當代英國文學、十九世紀英國文學、文藝復興文學等。Tanya Krzywinska接着報告該校有關電影與媒體研究的情形。Dany Nobus在加入座談後也簡單介紹正在籌劃成立的社會科學院。Nobus對Lacan心理分析深有研究，訪問團領隊廖炳惠特別邀請他日後來台灣參加心理分析的夏令營。

布魯納爾大學參與座談的教師對訪問團提出的可能合作項目或領域甚表興趣，並表示願意全力配合促成雙方的合作，包括學生交換、教師互訪、合作計畫、合辦研討會等。透過這次雙方座談，對方顯然對台灣的外國文學研究與文化研究有了較多的了解，初步的接觸效果甚佳。

布魯納爾大學近年來聲譽日昇，評鑑表現甚佳。近幾年聘請了不少重要學者加入教學與研究陣容，在研究方面提昇了不少。該校是個明顯多元種族和多元文化的教育機關，非白人學生約佔百分之四十。該校並藏有不少南亞移民的檔案與資料，可以善加利用。

該校校長Chris Jenks表示明年春天有意到台灣訪問，進一步與有興趣合作的學校商談。

與UCD (University College Dublin)。

六月十九日上午十點左右抵達TCD 校園，有專人負責導覽校園。十一時許，藝術與人文學院 (Faculty of Arts and Humanities) 院長Terence Brown親來迎接本團，到該校Old Library 的Henry Jones Room會談。時值期末考周，但該院仍有多名教師與會，其專長涵蓋中古文學與文藝復興文學、愛爾蘭文學、戲劇、後殖民主義文學、女性研究等。Terence Brown表示該校以Oscar Wilde Center 與Samuel Beckett文獻典藏著稱，愛爾蘭電影檔案數量亦頗豐，師資陣容更是堅強，涵蓋各領域，其中愛爾蘭文學、愛爾蘭移民史、愛爾蘭離散劇場等方面的研究，尤為該院特色。不過受限於經費與人事，他對與我方合作交換計畫態度審慎保守，認為初始階段格局不宜過大，或可由延聘該院教師擔任博士論文口試委員著手，並當場提出建議名單，包括Paul Delaney (二十世紀英國文學、愛爾蘭英文文學研究)、Kevin Rockett (電影研究) 等。

接受Terence Brown午餐款待後，驅車前往NUI Maynooth，約於下午四點抵達。該校位於都柏林西郊，人氣與地處市中心的TCD明顯不同，不僅校園罕見人跡，就連接待本團的人員，也僅有英語系系主任Chris Morash。即便如此，會談氣氛卻極為融洽。主人先簡介校史，談起該校經費由NIRSA (National Institute of Research on Space Analysis) 贊助，著重社會科學、地理、護理與醫學，人文學研究經費分配相對較少。不過現任校長上台後，致力推動多元文化教育，加上全國趨勢，使得該校英語系成為學生主修首選。基於校方政策，他對我方所提出的研究生雙學位以及教師學術交流計畫甚為開放，除了提供該系碩士班課程規劃 (現代愛爾蘭文學、後殖民書寫、帝國與殖民書寫) 資訊以及該系相關領與學者 (女性主義Margaret Kelleher、喬依斯研究Emer Nolan、後殖民論述Joe Cleary) 之外，還當場接受來台演講之邀約。

六月二十日上午九點專車抵達UCD校園，由該校古英文與中古英文文學教授Mary Clayton 帶領，到人文學研究院研討室會談，與會者有英語與戲劇系研究主持人Terence Dolan、人文學研究院院長 Marc Caball、民族音樂學副教授陳慧珊等。Mary Clayton強調過往愛爾蘭學生須遠赴英國劍橋、牛津深造，但如今情勢改變，多數學生願意留在國內接受學術訓練，而該校又為學生第一志願。該學院

經費充足，主導愛爾蘭虛擬研究圖書館與檔案計畫 (Irish Virtual Research Library and Archive Project)，英語與戲劇系師資齊備，領域涵蓋古英文、愛爾蘭英文文學、美國文學，尤以英國文學史、愛爾蘭研究、與歐洲文學研究見稱，並發行 *Irish University Review* 與 *Hiberno-English Review*，可謂愛爾蘭之文學研究重鎮。對於我方所提之研究生赴該校研修與教師共組研究團隊等構想，甚表歡迎。

國科會駐英科技組原打算安排本團於當天下午拜會爾蘭人文與社會科學研究委員會 (IRCHSS)，不過並未成功，極可能因為愛爾蘭近年來與中國大陸關係日漸友好。根據筆者側面了解，NUI Maynooth與中國大陸學術機構互動密切，Chris Morash就曾應邀到大陸演講，而UCD今年才和中國人民大學簽約，推動校際合作。以此看來，本學門若要和愛爾蘭相關領域學界合作，現階段不宜操之過急，而以個人、學會或國科會名義，邀請當地愛爾蘭研究、電影研究與後殖民論述等相關領域學者來台演講、出席研討會或講學，等累積足夠人脈後，才可能發展出近一步的合作關係。

六月二十一日早上，參訪團從都柏林搭飛機前往英國布里斯托(Bristol)。下午二時半抵達布里斯托大學(University of Bristol)的Institute of Advanced Studies，受到該校文學院院長Robert Fowler教授等人的接待。會議開始時先由公關Barry Taylor先生介紹該校的歷史和成就。查近年英國大學排名榜，該校差不多一直都在前十名內。文學院研發長(Research Director) David Punter教授接著報告該校近年的研究成績，和幾個重點研究主題，當中殖民主義和表演性(performativity)顯然和不少台灣學者的興趣相符合。廖召集人炳惠亦向對方介紹國科會外文學門近年的成果，以及準備和英國大學合作交流的幾個項目。出席會議者包括該校文學院的十多名老師，領域涵蓋歷史、英國文學、古典文學、意大利語以至於東亞系。整段交流時間，包括非正式的對話歷時約兩小時。列席的兩位台灣來的博士生，分別唸歷史和英國文學。

在茶敘時雙方有更直接的小組交談機會。該校東亞系同仁，如Dr Maurizio Marinelli等人都曾來台研究，對台灣並不陌生。歷史系的Robert Bickers教授、意大利語系的Charles Burdett博士和英文系的David Punter教授，都對殖民或後殖民議題深感興趣，期待日後在這方面台灣學者可以跟他們合作。當中Charles Burdett

對我們擬舉辦有關情感(emotion)的一個暑期學習營極感興趣，而其對意大利殖民現象的關注和對相關旅遊文學的研究，亦可提供予只熟悉英、法殖民史的台灣學者參考；反之，我們對日本殖民主義的研究，亦足資他們借鑒。相信Burdett是該校最值得主動連繫的一員。不過該校英文系浪漫主義研究雖然非常扎實，幾位這方面的專家卻未表達強烈的合作意願，實在可惜。

參訪團六月二十五日早上八時出發，十時前抵University of Kent(肯特大學)，由研究中心主任Professor Rod Edmond (專研現代文學、文化歷史)負責接待，於Rutherford學院會晤，在座還有歐洲研究和比較文學研究所所長Professor Shane Weller等。駐英科技組的陳嘉猷副組長也出席。先聽取他們所做的簡介：1965年建校，肯特大學位於英格蘭東南方的坎特伯利城。坎特伯利是一個氣氛友善、熱情的小型中古世紀城市，數百年來一直是肯特郡的商業和文化中心，亦是中世紀英國國教的聖地。座落於市中心的坎特伯利大教堂更是歷史上著名的大教堂之一。全校學生人數約一萬五千多人，研究生中有一千多名是全職學生。肯特大學人文學院(Faculty of Humanities) 課程領域包括現代文學、歐洲文化研究和比較文學、歷史、戲劇和電影研習、視覺和表演藝術、中古文學研究中心等。並設有The Kent Institute for Advanced Studies in the Humanities (KIASH, <http://www.kent.ac.uk/kiash/>) 資助學術

演講、小型學術討論會和研討會的舉辦。另提及英國比較文學學會(British Comparative Literature Association)所舉辦的國際研討會，例如以「愚昧」(Folly)為主題的第十一屆國際研討會即於今年七月二至五日登場 (<http://www.swan.ac.uk/german/bcla/diary.htm>)。廖召集人簡單扼要地說明人文重點領域，強調參訪團所擬推動的各項計畫(包括博士班千里馬國外研究計畫；研習營、工作坊、演講、國際研討會；研究生及教授交流互訪；國際合作計畫、專書與期刊計畫、電子資料庫等)。

在雙方簡報後互相提問，兩位教授明確提出在學術合作方面的誠意，合作的主題可以朝比較文學，如戲劇、電影和視覺藝術，後殖民文學，離散文學，中古文學等方面思考。會後由Professor Rod Edmond、Professor Shane Weller帶領參觀校園，步行至餐廳，其中還有一位去年在肯特大學獲得中古文學博士學位的台灣學生作陪，中餐由Professor Rod Edmond款待，餐會中交流十分愉快。

下午走訪著名的坎特伯利大教堂，一窺英國大文豪喬叟(Geoffrey Chaucer)坎特伯利故事集(*The Canterbury Tales*)的舞台。宏偉壯麗的坎特伯利大教堂是羅馬風格和哥特風格結合的產物，也是該市的標誌性建築，並於1988年被列入世界文化遺產之一。

肯特大學是全英國第一所使用高速寬頻學術網路的學校，是英格蘭七所新興的現代化大學之一。近年來英文學門排名前進至十二名，可見其學術研究發展潛力。

台灣外文學界與該校可以合作之建議：

- 1)台灣各大學院校的戲劇系所、電影資料中心可以考慮和肯特大學戲劇、電影和視覺藝術學院 (<http://www.kent.ac.uk/sdfva/>) 進一步談合作計畫的可能性；
- 2)台灣西洋古典中世紀暨文藝復興學會(TACMRS)也可以和中古文學研究中心合辦古典中世紀暨文藝復興研討會；或邀請Professor Peter Brown (專研中古文學、Chaucer等) 為研討會之keynote speaker。
- 3)台灣比較文學學會可以和該校Professor Shane Weller，依其後殖民文學的學術專長，共同研擬雙方有興趣的主題，舉辦國際研討會；或邀請為研討會之keynote speaker。

可合作之對象簡歷如下：

Professor Rod Edmond, Director of Research, Postcolonial Studies

Rod Edmond is Professor of Modern Literature and Cultural History at the University of Kent. He just published *Leprosy and Empire: A Medical and Cultural History* (2007). His previous publications include *Representing the South Pacific: Colonial Discourse from Cook to Gauguin* (1997) and, as co-editor with Vanessa Smith, *Islands in History and Representation* (2003).

Professor Shane Weller, Reader in Comparative Literature, Director of the MA in European and Comparative Literary Studies

His publications include: *A Taste for the Negative: Beckett and Nihilism* (2005); *Beckett, Literature, and the Ethics of Alterity* (2006); *The Flesh in the Text*, co-edited with Thomas Baldwin and James Fowler (2007); and *Literature, Philosophy, Nihilism: The Uncanniest of Guests* (forthcoming in 2008).

Professor Peter Brown, Professor of Medieval English Literature at the University of Kent. 二〇〇七年六月二十六日上午十時左右，訪問團自倫敦抵達位於Colchester的艾塞克斯大學 (University of Essex)。這是一所新型的大學，校園佔地甚廣，綠樹甚多。我們今天主要拜訪的單位是文學、電影與戲劇系 (Department of Literature, Film, and Theatre Studies)。由於系主任John Gillies不在，在與我們聯繫時已經說好由資深教授Jonathan White接待。陪同White接待我們的還有Peter Hulme, Owen Robinson, Hiroko Tanaka等。White是意大利文學與文化史專家，Hulme治加勒比海文學，甚受國際同行的敬重。Robinson的專業是美國文學。Tanaka為日裔學者，是一位社會學家。

首先由Jonathan White致歡迎詞。訪問團領隊廖炳惠隨即說明我們的訪問目的，以及未來雙邊可以共同合作的領域與方向。Owen Robinson接着報告該系的組織、教學與研究情形。White另外請Peter Hulme介紹他所主持的一項大型研究計畫：American Tropics: Towards a Literary Geography (January 2007 to December 2010)。

雙方經過交換意見之後，認為可以進行若干互惠的做法。我們特別提出國科會的千里馬計畫，希望該系能在這方面提供協助，讓台灣相關科系的博士生在撰寫論文的階段到該系研究或接受指導。這個提議獲得對方首肯。Peter Hulme甚至

表示願意接受我國博士生加入他的研究團隊。Jonathan White也對中山大學和輔仁大學輪流主辦的文藝復興研討會表示興趣，希望有機會到台灣參與相關的學術活動。

該校在電影研究方面頗有建樹，我們認為交通大學和中央大學在亞洲電影研究方面可以給予他們可能的協助，並建立進一步的合作關係。我們也指定若干議題，希望能進行合作，如離散研究、全球化、美國研究、網路溝通、新媒體文本等。合作的形式包括互訪、共同計畫、共同舉辦研討會與夏令營或工作坊等。

參訪團於早上11:00抵達該校，由該校教授兼系主任Robert Hampson接待，該系教師Jennifer Neville, Ewan Fernie, Tim Armstrong, Anne Varty等五人全程參與隨後舉行的簡報。由於時間緊湊，此次參訪團並未進行完整的簡報，但廖召集人仍掌握時間，簡單扼要地說明參訪團所擬推動的各項計畫（包括博士班千里馬國外研究計畫、工作坊、演講、國際合作計畫、專書與期刊計畫、電子資料庫）。

雙方簡報結束之後，該系教授開始提問，並於午餐時間繼續進行討論。Ewan Fernie教授指出，跨國學術合作計畫除了探討不同文化的同質性之外，亦可凸顯不同文化的差異性，以及不同文化體系的各種美學想像。Robert Hampton教授則明確指出，該系同仁的研究取向頗能呼應台灣學界的研究趨勢，尤其在前現代文學的研究（中古時期文學）與現代文學（包括喬以斯與愛爾蘭文學）的研究，雙方應有合作的空間。另外，該系在後殖民文學研究已佔據一席之地，而台灣的後殖民文學研究亦有相當可觀的成績，這亦是可持續發展的議題。廖炳惠召集人與李有成教授並旋即呼應他的看法，明確指出在學術合作方面，雙方的合作應留意下列幾點：

- 一、合作的主題應明確界定，並需配合雙方學界的學術專長與興趣。
- 二、合作的方式，除了透過AHRC與NSC接受雙方學界所共同提出的學術研究計畫申請書之外，亦可進行校與校（系與系）之間的合作計畫。AHRC與NSC所推動的國際合作計畫，可做為雙方合作的基本平台。
- 三、學術合作必須逐步落實，並循序漸進，在雙方獲得默契之後，逐步推展與延伸。

最後，雙方並同意博士生的進修計畫應是立即可以推動的計畫。

本參訪團於六月二十八日早上十時，抵達諾丁漢特倫特大學，受到該校Martyn Bennett教授 (Associate Dean for Research and Graduate Studies)及David Worrall教授的迎接。Worrall教授首先介紹了該校英文系的特色和研究焦點。簡而言之，該校英文系目前最強的研究項目，是英國浪漫詩人布雷克(William Blake)和旅遊文學。以Worrall為首的布雷克研究團隊為數四人，最近開始和塔特陳列館(Tate Gallery)合作，研究布雷克具有插圖的詩作。該校設有全英唯一的一個旅遊文學研究中心，由Time Youngs教授主持。Youngs和Essex大學Peter Hulme教授近年保持緊密的合作，合編過兩本旅遊文學的專書，亦是Studies in Travel Writing學報的主編。他們對旅遊與帝國、殖民等課題特別感興趣。

稍後該校的副校長Peter Jones等學者與參訪團展開會議，廖召集人向對方介紹了國科會外文學門近年的研究成果，和可能合作的模式。簡報為時約二十分鐘。稍後在非正式交談時，John Goodridge教授向我們介紹該校英文系所擁有的Trent Editions出版社。他們目前的幾個出版系列當中，值得一提的是由Elleke Boehmer教授主編的後殖民寫作系列(Postcolonial Writings series)。由於國內頗多學者對後殖民寫作極感興趣，也許會有合作的空間。至於該校的典籍整理計畫，則有剛開展的英國勞工詩人計畫(The Labouring Class Poets Project)。預計彙整的資料將編成詩集合六大冊，由Trent出版社印行。此外該校尚收藏了一些英國旅遊文學較罕見的書籍，可供參考。

※ 可能合作的方向：

雖然布雷克團隊很有誠意尋找台灣學者跟他們合作，可惜目前國內學者當中似乎並沒有許多人在積極研究布雷克的作品。反觀旅遊文學方面，我們不少對帝國、殖民主義與文學，及後殖民論述感興趣的學者，或多或少都會涉獵旅遊文學作品。訪談後翌日Youngs亦主動寫信表達合作的意願。也許透過Youngs我們可以再連繫Peter Hulme，還有倫敦大學King's College的Susan Castillo，乃至於格拉

斯哥大學的Nigel Leask教授，展開有關(後)殖民及旅遊文學方面的初步交流，探索進一步合作的可能性。

以下是該校旅遊文學研究中心網頁所提供的自我介紹：

Nottingham Trent University's Centre for Travel Writing Studies (CTWS) exists to facilitate, promote and disseminate scholarly research on travel writing and its contexts, without restriction of period, locus, or type of travel writing. We define travel writing broadly and encourage multi- and cross-disciplinary approaches. The Centre, which has strong international links, arranges talks and readings by visiting speakers, hosts self-funded researchers on short- and medium-term visits, and organises seminars and conferences. The Centre welcomes applications from students wishing to work on travel at Master's or doctoral level. Informal inquiries about the Master's Programme or about travel writing-related topics for MPhil/PhD supervision can be addressed to Members of the Centre include its Director, Professor Tim Youngs (19th- and 20th-century British and US travel writing), Professor Tim Fulford (travel and Romanticism), Dr Sharon Ouditt (British travellers to Italy), Professor Stan Smith (travel and modernism), Dr Carl Thompson (travel and Romanticism, 20th-century British travel writing), and Professor Patrick Wright (Travel in 20th-century Britain, British and US travellers to the Soviet Union and Communist China)". The international, refereed journal *Studies in Travel Writing* (White Horse Press), is edited by Professor Youngs from the Centre, and The Centre has a small but growing archive and is especially keen to develop its collection of PhD theses on travel writing and travel contexts.

本參訪團於六月二十八日下午抵達諾丁漢大學(University of Nottingham)校本部參訪。諾丁漢大學近年來致力於亞洲校區的開拓，目前有馬來西亞校區以及寧波校區二海外校區，也因為與亞洲高等教育密切之聯繫，因此對於本參訪團之到來極為重視，也極為禮遇。首先由國際事務副校長(Pro-Vice Chancellor for Internationalisation)、也是美國文學與文化研究專家Douglas Tallack教授致詞歡

迎，隨後與該校教師展開簡報與討論，由該校資深教授Ron Carter主持。晚宴則與該校之Council Room進行，由該校國際事務辦公室主任Vinenzo Raimo及負責聯絡之Sean Matthews教授款待。

簡報部分本團循例由召集人廖炳惠教授就書面以及投影片資料進行約二十至三十分鐘左右之報告。其後則開始問談與討論時間，經Carter教授歸納，該校與台灣外文學界可合作之範圍包括以下幾個範疇：

- 1.diaspora studies
- 2.American studies and cultural studies (including film studies, critical theories, etc.)
- 3.digital materials
- 4.international publication projects

本人更具體之合作建議如下：

1. 該校研究離散文學及具盛名之Roger Bromley教授，可與由李有成教授主持、中山大學為主的離散研究團隊共同合作進行跨國研究，Bromley教授應該是我們極力邀請的首要對象。
2. 副校長Douglas Tallack教授對於美國城市空間以及視覺文化之研究也可以與台灣美國研究與影像研究學者合作，再加上 Tallack教授是該校主掌國際事務者，在英國學界亦頗具影響力，若能適時邀約來台，對於台英兩國的學術合作應當有相當正面之影響。
3. 會談主持人Ron Careter教授雖屬應用語言學者，但曾經傳寫過英國文學史，文學研究造詣亦深，他近年來致力推動文學教學的各種課程，可以考慮邀請作為相關領域之工作方或研討會之keynote speaker。
4. 當代文學與文化研究的部份可以考慮與Mac Daly、Sean Matthews、James Moran等年輕學者合作。Daly教授以研究馬克思主義及後現代主義為主，Matthews教授是D H Lawrence研究中心主任，Moran教授專長為當代愛爾蘭劇場，都有與台灣學界合作之空間，可以考慮研討會時邀請他們參與。特別是Moran教授的專長與林玉珍教授愛爾蘭研究極有合作之可能，可以考慮組成跨國之研究團隊。

諾丁漢大學可合作之對象簡歷如下：

Professor Douglas Tallack, Pro-Vice Chancellor for Internationalisation

Professor Tallack has twice won the Arthur Miller Prize for the best article in American Studies. His current work concerns visual culture in New York City, and an electronic book on Global and Local Cities (part of a series of electronic books in the

Humanities and Social Sciences, sponsored by Universitas 21). Professor Tallack directed the Arts and Humanities Research Board 3 Cities Project. HE is a member of the UK Government's Marshall Aid Commemoration Commission. His research interests embrace American intellectual and cultural history; American visual culture and theory; Literary and Visual Representations of Cities; The Short Story; Modernism and Post-modernism; Critical Theory. He was formerly Head of the School of American and Canadian Studies. He is on the Advisory Board of the China Policy Institute at the University of Nottingham.

Professor Roger Bromley

Chair in Cultural Studies at the University of Nottingham. He is the author of *Lost Narratives: Popular Fictions, Politics and Recent History* (1988), *Narratives for a New Belonging: Diasporic Cultural Fictions* (2000), *From Alice to Buena Vista: the Films of Wim Wenders* (2001), and co-editor of *A Cultural Studies Reader: History, Theory, Practice* (1995), and *A Reader in Cultural Studies* (1999). He pioneered the academic study of popular fiction in the 1970s and has also published a large number of scholarly articles and book chapters, and spoken at conferences in 19 countries. As well as working on issues of migration, identity, and narrative, he has written on film from a cultural studies perspective, and his work in progress, *Narratives of Hope? Conflict, Reconciliation and Cultural Fictions* (on film, literature, performance and commemoration in the context of Bosnia, Rwanda, and South Africa) combines these different approaches. He is on the management board of the Centre for the Study of Post-Conflict Cultures at the University of Nottingham, and for a number of years he was on the executive of the Association for the Teaching of African, Caribbean, and Asian Literatures (Vice-President), chaired the Raymond Williams Trust, and sat on the Board of Directors of the Broadway Media Centre in Nottingham. He has also worked at the universities of Portsmouth, Gloucestershire, and Nottingham Trent and holds three visiting professorships in European universities. He visited Taiwan in 1995.

Professor Ron Carter

My main research interests are in the broad field of applied linguistics. This includes work on corpus and computational linguistics, discourse-based grammar, English vocabulary and the interface between language and literature. In terms of literature and language, my main interest is in the relationship between language and creativity and I have recently completed a book on this topic with particular reference to spoken discourse. I am currently working on two ESRC-funded e-social science projects

researching the multi-modal relationship between language and gesture and on a national AHRC-funded project into the applications of humanities research to business contexts. I also have current research interests in the discourses of professional and media communication using corpus-linguistic analytical tools. I am advisor to Routledge Publishers, London in English language studies, applied linguistics and English language teaching and learning.

I have written, co-authored, edited and co-edited over forty books and one hundred articles in these fields. The most current publication is *The Cambridge Grammar of English: A Comprehensive Guide to Spoken and Written Grammar and Usage* (CUP, 2006) (co-written with Michael McCarthy) and based on a 10 year research programme involving the development of extensive computer-readable corpora of spoken and written English. The book won the 2007 British Council English Language Innovation Award.

I have been at Nottingham University since 1979 and have been Director of the Centre for English Language Education and Head of the School of English Studies. I am currently Director of the Humanities Research Centre, chair the Humanities and Social Sciences Research Strategy Group and am a member of University Research Committee.

I am a member of the English Panel for the 2008 RAE (Research Assessment Exercise), with particular responsibility for English language and applied linguistics. I am on the Editorial Boards of the journals *Applied Linguistics*, *Journal of Applied Linguistics*, *Language and Literature*, *Language Awareness* and *RELC Journal*, and was recently an Editorial Advisor for the *Encarta World English Dictionary*. I am on the Advisory Board of IATEFL. I was chair of BAAL (British Association for Applied Linguistics) from 2003-2006 and was recently elected a fellow of the British Academy for Social Sciences.

Dr Macdonald Daly

Mac Daly is Director of Undergraduate Studies and Exams Officer in Critical Theory & Cultural Studies. Macdonald Daly's teaching and research interests include Marxism and Postmodernism, particularly their implications for the practical analysis of cultural texts. His publications include editions of texts by various nineteenth- and twentieth-century literary authors for Penguin and Dent, as well as papers in a wide variety of journals, including *The Modern Language Review* and *Critique*. He has published *Crackpot Texts: Absurd Explorations in Modern and Postmodern Literature* (1997) and *A Primer in Marxist Aesthetics* (1999). A new edition of the volume *Karl Marx and Frederick Engels on Literature and Art* is forthcoming. He is also co-editor of *Keywords: A Journal of Cultural Materialism*.

Dr Sean Matthews

Sean Matthews is Lecturer in Modern and Contemporary Literature, and Director of the D.H. Lawrence Research Centre. He has published widely on cultural theory and twentieth century literature, and has taught on these topics in Britain, Japan, the US, and, for the British Council, in Hungary, Romania, and Bulgaria. His Raymond Williams is forthcoming in the Routledge Critical Thinkers series (ed. Robert Eaglestone), and he is currently working on a major study, *The Uses of Lady Chatterley*. His anthology of critical theory, *Theories: A Reader*, edited with Aura Sibisan of the University of Brasov, Romania, was published in 2003, and included his introductory essays and apparatus. He has recently directed events, panels, lectures and seminars around issues in contemporary studies for the British Council ('Reading Worlds', The Oxford Conference 2004; and 'Reading Reputations', the Oxford Conference 2005); the CCUE Annual Conference ('Contemporary Classrooms', Oxford 2004); ESSE ('Chronotopes of the Contemporary', Zaragoza 2004); and the Learning and Teaching Support Network, LTSN ('Condition of the Subject', London 2003). He is a contributor to contemporarywriters.com, and reviews for a number of newspapers and journals.

Dr James Moran

My research is primarily concerned with twentieth century drama. I am particularly interested in the theatre of Ireland, and my previously published work examines plays by writers such as Sean O'Casey, W.B. Yeats, and G.B. Shaw, as well as analysing a range of non-literary dramatic performances. I am currently writing a study of theatre and performance events staged in Birmingham from the nineteenth century to the present. I also teach on a number of modules at Nottingham, and convene the undergraduate modules 'Introduction to Drama' and 'Twentieth-Century Plays', as well as the MA module, 'The Role of the Dramaturg'.

Vinzenzo Raimo – Head of International Office

As Head of International Student Recruitment, Vincenzo is responsible for the promotion of the University of Nottingham overseas and for supporting teaching and research links world-wide. On 1 July 2007 Vincenzo takes on the role of Director of the University's International Office with overall responsibility for implementing the University's internationalisation strategy including areas such as Transnational Education (TNE) support, international scholarships policy, mobility and international student support.

With campuses in China and Malaysia and more than 7,000 international students representing 142 countries at its campuses in the UK, The University of Nottingham has one of the largest groups of international students of any UK university and is

considered to have one of the most innovative internationalisation strategies among universities world-wide.

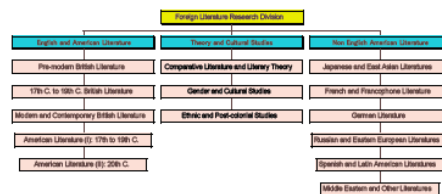

About Foreign Literatures Division

Foreign Literatures Division under the aegis of National Science Council Taiwan supports individuals and teams from the arts and humanities research community islandwide, to foster new knowledge as well as to cultivate intellectual capacity in response to diverse ways of imagining the world across languages and cultures. It consists of 14 sections and funds not only research projects on authors and periods from literatures other than Chinese, but projects on a wide range of topics such as global diasporas and migrant subjects, new literatures in English, translational and transnational approaches to foreign literatures, comparative study in colonialism and modernity, gender and identity formation, minority discourse, eco-criticism, film and psychoanalysis, reception of European theories in Asia, etc.



In addition to promoting internationalization of publication and research exchange, the Division seeks to expand its network of collaborations and global initiatives. Over the years, distinguished literary critics from different parts of the world have joined our summer institutes, conferences, workshops, visiting researcher or postdoc programs. The Division sponsors book projects and translation of western or Asian classics, providing matching salaries so that scholars may be relieved from regular teaching tasks up to two years. It also oversees that PhD candidates and junior faculty can go abroad for archival research or fieldwork from six months to one year.







Possibilities of Future Collaborations:

A. Empire and literature:
This area of research is obviously on the rise. Given the fact that empire and literature and postcolonial studies are very well-established in the UK and Ireland, we believe this is an excellent point of departure for our future scholarly collaborations and exchange.

B. Travel writings:
Travel literature during the long nineteenth century is already an established field in the West. We believe that Taiwanese scholars, familiar with Asian cultures and proficient in Asian languages, are able to share their different experience and knowledge with fellow researchers here. We can, for example, go beyond the so-called imperial travelers' "gaze" on the East and study the Asians' "return gaze."

C. Interdisciplinary and comparative studies:
Some exciting preliminary work has been done in Taiwan. British and Irish scholars interested in cross-cultural and interdisciplinary studies may wish to expand their horizons by working with fellow researchers from Taiwan, and vice versa. The long nineteenth century was a time of imperial conflicts as well as fruitful cultural exchange; this interesting background is definitely conducive to collaborative work between us.

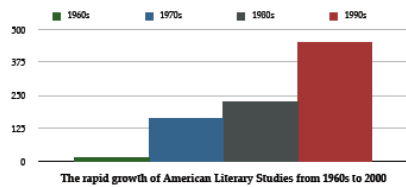

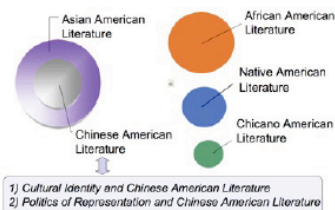

Recent Developments

New Territories to be mapped

The cases offered tend to focus on North America or the English-speaking Indian or Caribbean communities. Comparative accounts have recently appeared, but they generally discuss global networks of capitalism initiated and controlled by the US.

In the Study of Chinese diasporas, for instance, a large proportion have been devoted to Asian Americans or the notion of "Chineseness," with only a handful to the Chinese of Europe, Australia, or Southeast Asia. (Liao Ping-hui, "Project Report," 2006)

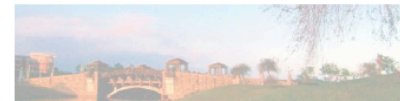

Thank you once again for your visit to AHRC. I hope you both had a good trip back to London and enjoyed your weekend there after what was a very busy schedule. It sounds like it has been a highly productive visit and I found our exchange to be particularly fruitful in suggesting new areas of collaboration.

I will send you a note of all the areas we discussed in due course, but at this point I would like to focus on one area where we could make an immediate impact: a thematic call for networks of UK and Taiwanese that would coincide with the call for proposals for the Beyond Text strategic programme.

There is need for urgent action here, as Professor Welch will be finalising the call for proposals in the next few weeks. I will be meeting Professor Welch next Tuesday (10 July) and this is one of the items we will discuss. It would be useful to have an indication from you both before then as to how you would wish to proceed.

My initial thoughts are that Taiwanese-UK proposals would be submitted to the Beyond Text programme and compete on the basis of excellence with other UK-based proposals. We would ask NSC to nominate Taiwanese reviewers for bilateral proposals and in all other respects the mechanism would be the same as that outlined in the MoU. The Beyond Text commissioning panel would have to make the final funding recommendations. NSC would then provide matching funding for successful applications.

As I say, this is a rough outline which can be refined over the coming weeks.

I look forward to hearing your response.
